Background

The Liam Colgan Music Fund (LCMF) was established in 2020 in memory of a young Inverness singer/songwriter. Our aim was to provide support and assistance to young musicians and others across the Highlands and Islands, like Liam, who are keen to pursue their ambitions in music.

Since its launch in October 2020, LCMF has made a real mark on the music scene in the Highlands, emerging to become one of the most dynamic small youth music charities in the creative industries sector in the North of Scotland.

Our work

Over the past three years, we have undertaken a range of activities and programmes to support young people keen to get into music.

We have organised online workshops for young songwriters, provided grants to enable young people to attend conferences, donated instruments, created awards for young musicians and songwriters, sponsored a stage at a local music festival to showcase the finalists and raised over £20,000, through fundraising, sales and donations, to fund our programmes and events.

From the outset, we have partnered with the University of the Highlands & Islands (UHI) in establishing annual awards for music students, working with graduates helping with the Fund's promotional music video and a social media marketing campaign. Last year, we contributed to a hardship fund for music students attending UHI NWH College Alness.







In 2022, the Fund became the first organisation in the North of Scotland to receive a donation for its work from the **BRIT Trust**, the UK music industry's principle charity.

The BRIT Trust donation has helped fund one of the highlights of our work to date, our ground-breaking **'SETTING THE STAGE'** training workshops for young people interested in learning about live event production (sound, lighting, backline and event management).





This full-day workshop, based around a simulated live music gig, offers young people a unique opportunity to get practical, handson experience, working with industry professionals and live bands in a real-world setting.

Local professionals engineers provide instruction in setting up the stage, sound, and lighting with trainees then getting basic instruction in using the equipment with three live bands brought in specially to assist iwth the workshop,





The recent workshop also incorporated breakout seesions with industry professionals holding Q&A sessions on the live event industry.

A trainee 'production crew' is assigned to each artist/band, to work with them, learning how to manage the stage and control the sound and lights, as each band performs a few numbers.





The Future

The current trustees believe if the Fund is to build on its work to date and capitalise on the opportunities it has created, such as the 'Setting the Stage' workshops, can only be achieved by bringing in people with new ideas, skills and fresh energy.
